Kia koutou te whanau - From our Tumuaki


Term 1 is almost finished. There has been plenty going on at our place over the last 11 weeks.


Swimming lessons and swimming sports have all added to the rich mix of term 1 learning.

Swimming Survey Results

Thank you to the **66** parents who responded to our survey regarding swimming lessons and swimming sports. Here is a summary of your responses and the actions we will be taking as a consequence of this feedback:

- The preference of term was very evenly split between Terms 1 and 4. Many parents felt that
 the start of the year was disruptive to establishing back to school routines. In response to this
 and feedback from our teachers and students, we have decided to trial having swimming
 lessons in Term 4 of 2025. Our swimming sports will continue to be in Term 1, as they align
 with North Zone and Canterbury Swimming Sports
- 50% of respondents said their child did not enter the swimming sports because they were
 unsure if they could swim the required 25m distance. In response to this, we will be
 requesting that Aqua Gym assess all students on their ability to swim 25m and we will report
 this information to parents. Those students who cannot do so, will then have the summer
 holidays to practice so they can enter the sports in term 1.
- There were some useful suggestions for how we could encourage greater participation in swimming sports. We are in the process of looking at alternative venues that could accommodate all of Year 5 and 6 and allow us to have more of a festival type of event where the competition is only part of the day.

Reporting to you: Our Learning Conversations are published on Hero this Friday

Learning Conversations are a key feature of our assessment and reporting at Paparoa Street School. Through these regular conversations, we aim to capture the successes and progress of our learners. They provide a deliberate time in the day to pause and reflect with individuals. Learning Conversations help develop students' confidence and capabilities. This enables them to see themselves as learners who are ready, willing and able to choose, design, research, pursue, troubleshoot and evaluate learning for themselves, alone and with others, in school and out.

This year, we aim to enhance communication between school and whānau by regularly updating you on these meetings. To achieve this, we will provide summaries each term. This week, you will receive a summary of your child's Learning Conversation in one core curriculum area (either maths, writing or reading), with the other two areas being shared in weeks 5 and 10 of term 2. Please look out for these on Hero on Friday afternoon.

Remember! Our Parent Library is in the office waiting room! Good chance to get some reading for the holidays!


Open hours


